SUBJECT: Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for notifications related to explosives demolition activities at Fort Wingate Depot Activity (FWDA)

The purpose of this SOP is to document notification requirements related to explosives demolition activities at FWDA. Please ensure that all contractors performing demolition activities at FWDA are aware of these requirements. Minimum requirements are outlined in the Army's application to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requesting a Special Use Airspace - Controlled Firing Area (CFA), dated 05 June 2019, and the FAA's subsequent LETTER OF AUTHORIZATION, AERONAUTICAL CASE NO. 19-AWP-20NR, AUTHORIZATION - CONTROLLED FIRING AREA, FORT WINGATE, WINGATE, NEW MEXICO, signed and approved on 24 June 2019. Both documents are attached for reference.

In addition to the minimum requirements outlined in the FAA authorization, the Army includes the following requirements for all demolition activities in the Corrective Action Management Unit (CAMU) and Blow-In-Place (BIP) demolitions at FWDA:

- Scheduled demolitions shall only take place from Mondays through Saturdays.
- The Senior UXO Supervisor / Blasting Supervisor must notify the Gallup Airport Manager by email at: 9-asw-zadmos@faa.gov ((505) 863-5501) at least twenty-four (24) hours, or as soon as possible, before a planned demolition, or immediately for an unexpected demolition.
- The Senior UXO Supervisor / Blasting Supervisor must notify the White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) Air Traffic and Airspace (AT&A) Officer by email at: kenneth.d.lance.civ@mail.mil ((575) 678-4087) at least twenty-four (24) hours, or as soon as possible, before a planned demolition, or immediately for an unexpected demolition.
- The Senior UXO Supervisor / Blasting Supervisor must notify the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) by email at: dave.cobrain@state.nm.us ((505) 476-6055) and Benjamin.Wear@state.nm.us ((505) 476-6041) at least twenty-four (24) hours, or as soon as possible, before a planned demolition, or immediately for an unexpected demolition. Notifications must identify the specific MEC items to be demolished.
- Notices to Airmen (NOTAM) must be published twenty-four (24) hours, or as soon as possible, before a planned demolition, or immediately for an unexpected demolition.

The requirements above shall be in effect indefinitely. As noted in the CFA authorization, CFA renewal proposals must be submitted to the appropriate service area office at least four (4) months prior to the proposed effective dated. The current CFA is in effect through 01 June 2021.

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
